Sarum College is only a few minutes' walk from both the train and bus stations. A five-screen cinema and a well-regarded theatre are also nearby.

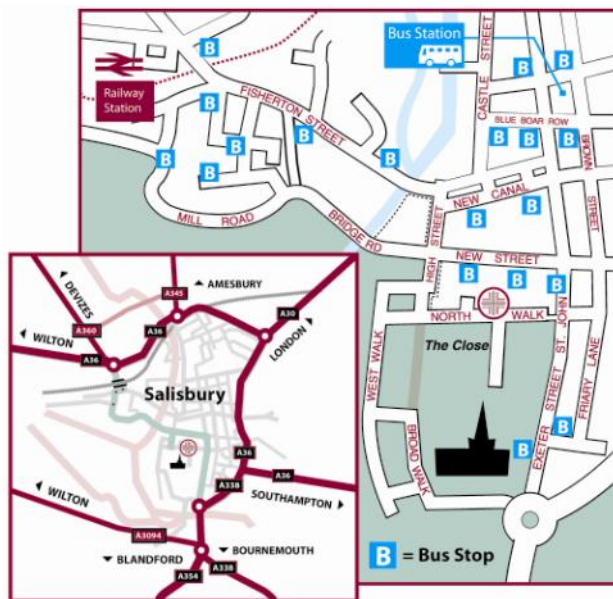
SALISBURY CATHEDRAL



The College is in the Cathedral Close, within the shadow of the cathedral.

Public transport is the best way to travel to Sarum College.

Arrival by bus or train

The College is approximately a 15-minute walk from either station.

Park and Ride

There are four drop-off sites:

From the North: A345 (Beehive Roundabout)

From the South: A338 at Britford

From the East: A30 London Road

From the West: A36 At Wilton

The Programme

Faith-based organisations such as schools, churches and charities evoke and respond to experience of the deepest kinds.

The kinds of expectations expressed in transference and projections are always difficult to spot and demanding to handle.

This training workshop is designed for those who lead in such settings and for those who offer mentoring, coaching or consultancy to them to develop:

- Greater capacity to be aware of unconscious processes as they emerge in experience
- Better understanding of how these unconscious and systemic processes impact in organisational life
- Greater skill in weaving together awareness and understanding as a resource in leading or consulting

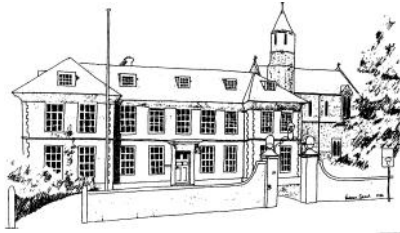
This programme will provide:
